## Course Title: Algebra 1 School: MVHS UC/CSU requirement: Yes/Yes Textbook and/or other learning resources: Algebra 1 Houghton Mifflin Harcourt

## Student Learning Outcomes:

Topics include basic operations and properties of the real number system, linear and quadratic equations and inequalities, and basic coordinate geometry of lines. Also studied are systems of equations in two (2) variables, properties of exponents, rational expressions, irrational numbers and radicals, and word problems related to the above topics. In this course, students will build foundational Algebraic skills for higher math courses.

Assessment and Grading (<u>BP 5121</u> / <u>AR 5121</u>): To ensure that every student has an equal opportunity to demonstrate their learning, the course instructors implement aligned grading practices and common assessments with the same frequency.

 Grading categories and their percentage weights: 20% Final Exam 40% Tests

20% Quizzes

20% HW/CW/Notebook

Each test will be cumulative, covering material from the beginning of the semester. The cumulative tests will give students multiple opportunities to demonstrate understanding and to improve their grade. Each consecutive cumulative test score will replace the one previous test score only if the grade is higher.

2. Achievement evidence collected within each grading category:

Final Exam: One cumulative final exam per semester.

Tests: There will be 3-5 cumulative tests each semester, each will be equally weighted within the 40% Tests category.

Quizzes: There will be at least two quizzes for every unit.

HW/CW/Notebook: Daily homework including most weekends.
