Student Learning Outcomes:

The Level III course is conducted in Spanish and students are expected to use Spanish in class. Students will develop proficiency in the three modes of communication: Interpersonal, Interpretive, and Presentational. Please see below for more explanation.

The students' listening and speaking skills are further developed with an emphasis on original and spontaneous self-expression. In addition, students are introduced to literature in Spanish and engage in oral and written discussions based on their reading.

Students in this class are expected to invest in learning about the Spanish language and Spanish and Latin American cultures.

Assessment and Grading (BP 5121 / AR 5121): To ensure that every student has an equal opportunity to demonstrate their learning, the course instructors implement aligned grading practices and common assessments with the same frequency.

c. Presentational

Formal speaking and writing (class and small group presentations, essays/compositions)
